In his current role, Matt ensures quality control in the clean room, overseeing manufacturing processes to ensure products are correctly assembled, labeled,



and safely packaged for shipment. Beyond technical tasks, Matt has embraced leadership responsibilities. As an "assistant to the lead," he supports associates by answering questions, coordinating tasks, and fostering a collaborative atmosphere. His work includes using specialized computer systems like "Connect 2.0" to maintain accurate progress notes, showing his ability to adapt and grow in complexity.
